A Name Like No Other

The Majesty of God's Name – God is majestic and exalted by everything He does.

Psalm 138:1-8

God is Majestic because He is worthy of great adoration & respect for who He is (Most High), what He's done (Great Things), and what He is doing (Great Things).

I. Psalm 138:1-3 (God is Majestic because He hears & answers our prayers)

- A. God is majestic because He hears and answers our prayers. (vs. 1-3)
1 Peter 5:7 (NLT); Matthew 7:11; 1 Peter 3:12 (AMP); 2 Chronicles 7:14
- B. When God hears and answers our prayers, then His name should be exalted or praised. (vs. 1-3)
Daniel 2:16-23; Luke 17:12-18

II. Psalm 138:4-5 (God is Majestic because He is a Promise Maker & Keeper)

- A. God is majestic because He is a Promise Maker who keeps His promises. (vs. 4-5)
2 Peter 1:4 (NLT); 2 Corinthians 1:20 (AMP)
- B. When God keeps His promises, then His name should be exalted or praised. (vs. 4-5)
Genesis 21:1-3. 5-7 (AMP); Luke 2:25-30

III. Psalm 138:6-8 (God is Majestic because He cares about the least of us)

- A. God is majestic because He cares about the humble or the least of us from this world's perspective. (vs. 6-8)
Luke 4:18 (AMP); Matthew 19:14 (CSV)
- B. When God shows His concern for the least of us, then His name should be exalted or praised. (vs. 6-8)
Luke 2:8-11, 15-16, 20; Luke 8:27, 31-32, 38-39

“38 Now the man out of whom the devils were departed besought him that he might be with him: but Jesus sent him away, saying, 39 Return to thine own house, and shew how great things God hath done unto thee. And he went his way, and published throughout the whole city how great things Jesus had done unto him.” Luke 8:38-39 (KJV)
