

How God Speaks
God Speaks to His People – God loves us enough to speak to us.
Exodus 3:1-6, 11-15; 4:28-31

I. Exodus 3:1-6 (Sometimes God must get our attention to tell us what to do)

- A. Sometimes God must first do something to get our attention so that He can speak to us. (vs. 1-3)
1 Samuel 3:1-9 (NLV); Acts 2:1-6; Acts 10:9-17
- B. Sometimes when God speaks to us, He tells us what to do or gives us an assignment. (vs. 4-6) (***God gave Moses an assignment: Exodus 3:7, 10***)
Acts 2:36-39; Acts 10:19-21

II. Exodus 3:11-15 (God tells us that He will be with us as we obey Him)

- A. Sometimes we think that we are not qualified to do what God has assigned or asked us to do. (vs 11) (***None of us are qualified: 2 Cor 3:5 NLT***)
Judges 6:12-15 (TLB); 1 Corinthians 15:9-10 (CEV)
- B. God always comforts us by telling us that He will be with us as we strive to obey His Word. (vs. 11-15)
Matthew 28:19-20 (AMP); Judges 6:16 (AMP)

III. Exodus 4:28-31 (Tell others exactly and only what God has told us)

- A. We must tell others exactly and only what God has told us. (vs. 28-31)
John 17:17; Psalms 119:105; Deuteronomy 4:2 (AMP)
- B. God always confirms His Word with signs following. (vs. 28-31)
Isaiah 55:11 (AMP); Mark 16:19-20 (AMP)

Words of Encouragement:

“19 So then, when the Lord Jesus had spoken to them, He was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God. 20 And they went out and preached everywhere, while the Lord was working with them and confirming the word by the signs that followed.]” Mark 16:19-20 (AMP)
